- **EVENT-** 2018 Grammy Awards, MusiCares Person of the Year event honoring Fleetwood Mac.
- **ART-** Volcanic Stainless Steel Paintings. Fire, metal and a secret sauce to create permanent art that never fades and can't be destroyed. The artist's invention of creating images with fire has opened a whole new art world of ideas and a fresh, new art medium. Unique, remarkable, breathtaking and magical.
- **Milo** created two Volcanic Stainless Steel paintings for the event. Painting one, titled "**Gods and Goddesses**" -72"x49", is a group scene featuring the band members of Fleetwood Mac. Each member is dressed and posed with the likeness of Greek gods. The band has been immortalized as music gods. The art is in the style of a lost, ancient section of a frieze found in the ruins of the Parthenon. Inspired by a Portland Art Museum visit and 3,500 year old pottery. This one art panel leaves room for more frieze panels to the left and right of it. Painting two is a tribute to Prince and titled "**Purple Blues**" -42"x48". His musical genius and life's work demands a permanent art piece. So Milo painted Prince with fire until a magical, dreamy, impressionistic artwork was born of fire, metal and art genius.
